City of Venus History

Venus, Texas was founded in the 1880's under the name "Gossip" at the junction of three major railroads. It was incorporated in 1903 under the name of Venus. The founder J.C. Smythe named the town after the daughter of a local doctor. By the 1920s the population had grown from 10 residents to over 800 and had it's own schools, a small college, several local businesses, and a weekly newspaper.

During the Great Depression, the town of Venus saw a massive decline with many residents relocating into Dallas and Fort Worth in search of work. By 1940 the population had decreased to 200 and the only remaining business was a drug store. Venus began recovering in the 1940s and today boast a population of 4,361. Of the residents of Venus, roughly half the population lives in Patriot Estates HOA.

Peach Cobbler

1 cup self-rising flour

3/4 cup granulated sugar (plus 2 tablespoons for topping) 1/2 cup butter, divided and melted seperately 1 (29 ounce) can of sliced peaches in heavy syrup



- · Preheat the oven to 350 degrees.
- In a medium-size mixing bowl coarsely mix the flour, 3/4 cup of the sugar, and 1/4 cup melted butter together. You can add a dash of cinnamon here if you want too.
- Sprinkle about one-third of the flour mixture on the bottom of an 9x9 baking dish. The flour mixture will slightly mix with the syrup of the peaches while baking and thicken it up a bit.
- · Add the peaches with their juice to the dish. If you like your cobbler on the dry side don't add all of the liquid.
- Sprinkle the top of the peaches with the remaining sugar/flour mixture. Sprinkle the top with the remaining 2 tablespoons sugar. Drizzle with the remaining 1/4 cup of on melted butter on top of the batter. There will be a lot of liquid and it will look wet. Don't worry, the flour mixture will soak up the liquid.
- Bake for 40-45 minutes or until the top is golden brown and bubbly. Let cobbler sit for at least 5 minutes before serving.
- · Serve with a scoop of vanilla ice cream.

CC&R of the Month

Appearance

5.7 Both the lot and the dwelling must be maintained in a manner so as not to be unsightly when viewed from the street or neighboring lots. The ACC is the arbitrator of acceptable appearance standards.

What does this mean?

The property must be kept in good condition, including siding, roofs, fences, and outbuildings such as sheds. Compliance will be focused heavily on fencing as it has become an issues throughout Patriot Estates.

Fences must be kept in good repairs and consistent with the neighborhood aesthetic. There should be no missing panels or pickets, fences should not be leaning or falling down. Fences are permitted, but not required, to be stained a neutral wood color with ACC approval. Should you wish to make any changes to your fence other than repairs matching the original design, please submit an ACC request.
